WOOD CHIPS

During the collection period, the highway yard is open Monday through Friday 8:00 a.m. through 3:00 p.m. for residents wanting wood chips. Residents must bring their own container. The department also provides truck load delivery of wood chips as its schedule permits. Interested residents should contact the highway department 392-9464 for more information.

GRASSCYCLING

Your private refuse hauler is required to take grass clippings. However, the town (along with Monroe County) supports and encourages grasscycling. Grasscycling means leaving grass clippings on your lawn after each mowing. It not only enriches your lawn with important nutrients, but also reduces the demand on expensive landfills. Just leave the clippings on your lawn after mowing, or add them to your compost pile. Cut only the top 1/3 of your grass with each mowing. Remember to cut your grass when it is dry, and keep your mower blade sharp.
